WHAT IS IT? Parent Leadership Basecamp 201 is the follow-up to the April 29th NKY Parent Leadership Basecamp (101). Basecamp 201 is the next step for parents and community leaders interested in taking active roles in public education in Kentucky – for their own children and all children.
